GEOGRAPHY



Location

38°48′17″N 77°2′50″W



Elevation

Average of 97 feet above sea level; Ranges from -5 to 287



Area

15.3 mi squared containing a density of 9,314.3 persons per square mile

CLIMATE

Alexandria is a part of the Humid Subtropical climate zone, which includes hot, humid, summers, mild to chilly winters, and plentiful rain year-round. July is the warmest month of the year, and January is the coldest.



POPULATION

According to the United States Census Bureau, in 2010 there were 139,966 persons residing here. 21.8% of the population identifies as Black or African American, 60.9% identifies as White, 6% as Asian, and 16.1% identify as of Hispanic or Latino origin.



Adjacent Counties

Alexandria is bound to the east by the Potomac River and Prince Georges County, Maryland. To the south and west is Fairfax County, while the northern boundary is shared with Arlington County. We are roughly 4.8 miles south of Washington, D.C.

As you walk along Alexandria's historic streets, look for Wayfinding and Heritage Trail signs to learn about Alexandria's past, or use the self-guided tours.
